TRANSDERMAL GEL DIRECTIONS

Your veterinarian has prescribed your pet's medication in a transdermal gel. This form allows the medicine to be absorbed into the bloodstream through the skin of your pet's ear. Please follow the directions below. If you have any questions, please contact the pharmacy.

- 1. Wear gloves when applying the transdermal gel.
- 2. Push the prescribed amount of medication out of the applicator onto your fingers.
- 3. Rub the medication into the front of your pet's ear. Apply where there is the least amount of fur. You may apply to one or both ears. (The gel can be applied to any skin with little or no fur.)
- 4. Rub the gel in well (like you would hand lotion).
- 5. Remove gloves, and wash hands.
- 6. There may or may not be a thin film of powder left after the gel dries. This depends on the medication that is prescribed. If there is a thin film, it may be wiped off with a wet paper towel before the next application.
- 7. There are ______ doses per applicator.
- 8. Store the gel at room temperature.
