Hydrocodone liquid cough/cold formulations have been removed from the market due to being unapproved for cough. Some examples of liquid formulations containing hydrocodone are listed below.

PCCA Formula # 0061 Hydrocodone Bitartrate 1 mg/mL/ Homatropine Methylbromide 0.3 mg/mL Oral Syrup

PCCA Formula # 9240 Hydrocodone Bitartrate 2.5 mg/5 mL/Phenylephrine HCl 5 mg/5 mL/ Chlorpheniramine Maleate

2 mg/5 mL Oral Solution (SF)

PCCA Formula # 1188 Hydrocodone Bitartrate 0.5 mg/mL/Phenylephrine HCl 1 mg/mL/Chlorpheniramine Maleate 0.4 mg/mL Oral Syrup

PCCA Formula # 2433 Hydrocodone Compound Liquid

This "fly-safe" formula was presented at a PCCA International Seminar and is often requested in the winter before flying. A small amount is placed in the nostrils before the flight.

PCCA Formula # 5013 Tranilast 1%/Deoxy-D-Glucose (2) 0.19% in Shea Butter

PCCA Formula # 9355 Tranilast 1%/Deoxy-D-Glucose (2) 0.19%/EGCq 1%/Shea Butter Fly safe enhanced with EGCg, which has antiviral properties.

Anesthetic lollipop preparations may be beneficial to patients who have mono, strep throat or tonsillectomies.

Lollipops for cough/cold.
